

Math 102, Fall 2007: Practice Exam 2 for the First Midterm

1. Evaluate the following integral using substitution:

$$\int \frac{e^{2x}}{e^{2x} + 1} dx$$

2. Using integration by parts, compute the following integral:

$$\int e^{2x} \cos 3x dx$$

3. Find the following trigonometric integral:

$$\int (\sin^7 x) \sqrt{\cos x} dx$$

4. Evaluate the following integral using the method of partial fractions:

$$\int \frac{5x^3 + 2x^2 - 12x - 8}{x^4 - 8x^2 + 16} dx$$

5. Find the following integral using trigonometric substitution:

$$\int \frac{1}{(x^2 + 4x + 13)^{3/2}} dx$$
